## Routines

**P.E/Games** - P.E/Games will be taught weekly, every **Friday**. Please ensure your child comes into school with their **full P.E. kit on** and suitable footwear must be worn.

**Stationery** - No stationery will be needed from home, as school will provide all the equipment.

**Water Bottles** - Please provide your child with a labelled water bottle. Water bottles should be taken home at the end of each day, washed and then returned the following day. Water only please!

**Bags** - Due to limited peg space, please could your child not bring a bag to school (unless a kit is required for an after-school club).

**Weather** - As ever our weather is unpredictable, please ensure that your child wears appropriate clothing for both warm, cold and wet conditions. Layers of clothing are ideal, so that children can adapt to changes in the temperature.

**Homework** - Homework will now be sent home via a homework book **every Friday**. Please can your child's book be returned to school by the **following Wednesday** at the latest. Work that is handed in by Wednesday will be looked at by an adult. Please note that some homework may still be set via Google Classroom, but this will be detailed clearly when applicable. Please ensure pupils have their necessary log-in details at home to access Google Classroom, as well as other platforms we use including TTRockstars, Purple Mash and Mathletics.

As this is a very important year for Maple Class, there are a few ways in which you can support your child at home, such as reading daily, practising all the multiplication tables, reinforcing the spellings sent home and ensuring that homework is completed on time and handed in. By doing this, this will help your child to prepare themselves ready for next year.
