I hope you had an enjoyable Easter break. All the children are back safe and refreshed after the holidays and their residential stay at Llangrannog and it has been so lovely to hear their news about all the exciting activities they enjoyed.

This will, as usual, be a very busy term. Initially we will continue our study of coasts but then move onto our new topic-refugees.

In year 5 this will involve looking at journeys of refugees and also explorers. The children have previously expressed their interest in studying 'Space' and so we will also adapt our topic to include independent research on space explorers and other aspects of this fascinating topic.

The children will be developing their skills across the curriculum whilst exploring how the journey of the Earth gives us night and day and the seasons and also how the Moon affects tides. The children will be creating fact files and databases on planets by undertaking independent research. We will also study the recent eclipse.

Homework will usually be given on Thursdays and should be submitted by the following Wednesday. Can I please repeat the importance of listening to your child practise both their reading and multiplication skills.

Mrs Hadall will teach maths (topic based), RVE (Religion, Ethics and Values) and Welsh on Mondays. P.E/Games will be taught weekly on Tuesday afternoons. Children can wear PE kit school on their PE day.

All children should bring in a *labelled* water bottle daily. Please also supply your child with weather appropriate clothing. Coats and jumpers for cooler days, hats and sun lotion for warmer days.
