

## Road safety rules

Think about the safety rules you heard on the video. Discuss with a grown up why these rules are important to follow. We would like you to pretend to switch roles with each other when going for a walk. Your adult will pretend that they don't know the road safety rules and you need to teach them. Talk them through all the rules of the road and explain why it is important to follow them.

Could you make a road safety poster for your family to follow? Remember the poster needs to be bright and colourful so that it stands out. The heading and the writing on a poster is larger than we would normally write so that people can read the information clearly. A poster usually includes some super pictures to make it eye catching.

You can use any art effects, to create your poster. If you want to use paints, collage, pencil, ICT programme, etc. It is totally up to you. You are the creator!

\* Choose two rules that you think are important. Make a poster showing those two main rules.

\*\* Design a poster, adding any rules you think are important to follow in the village or in a more built up are. Add some pictures to help explain your rules.

\*\*\* Design your poster with important traffic rules. Can you research some facts to add to your poster about road safety. Sometimes when a poster is good people want to find out more information.

Dear Parent, This activity is about getting the children to understand the rules of the road and physically following them. Sometimes explaining knowledge to another person helps them mentally sort and understand the information (in this case rules) more fully as they have to process the information fully before sharing it with others. Applying this knowledge in a real life situation has massive benefits as they will link the information with a real life situation.
